And here we hit the brutal truth. For the answer to that question is generally much shorter and harder. Despite the enormous amounts of work churches are doing, the actual number of disciples declines.


Which is why, here, now – at the beginning of 2019 – I would like you to consider whether we need to re-think our activities– whether we need more events or whether we actually need more of God?

photoshopped celebrities. There is an overwhelming message portrayed to us that if we are happy and content with ourselves then we are doing it wrong.

Having shingles on your face is something that causes a markedly unpleasant physical change to your appearance. God used this to really challenge me over how I view myself. Am I comfortable in my own skin? Do I rely on the way I look to be confident when I step out of the house? Can I love myself for being me, in whatever shape and form that might be, or do I have a specific perception of how things should be?

As a young Christian growing up in the 'big world', I remember being taught to love

God and to love others. However, I don't remember hearing much about loving myself. In fact, many teachings in the New Testament suggest that we should aim to wholeheartedly serve God and others. However, interpreting these readings like that doesn't leave much space for loving ourselves; it also leaves us open to the question of how can we love others and show others how to be loved, if we don't first know how to love ourselves.

What does Jesus say? In Mark 12:29-31 we read: "The greatest commandment is love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these." (NIV) In this passage Jesus tells us firstly to love God. I think that most of us

I give thanks to you, TFM's supporters, particularly for praying for the Warmington mission. Over the Christmas period, a few TFMers joined the minister in leading and being involved in the services. We are now focusing our efforts on preparing for the 10-day mission that is taking place during Holy week this year. The vicar regularly preaches about God's saving grace through Jesus Christ, so it is safe to say that His Holy Spirit is already working away quietly in the background. Therefore, we are asking God for opportunities to open up during our time there this Easter.

God used my time over the last few months to challenge the way I see myself. For a lot of my time I wasn't well enough to interact with other people, leaving me in a position where if I wasn't asleep, I was alone. Yes, ok I was alone with God, but sometimes God chooses to stay quiet so that He can wait and see what happens; it is then that we are left alone, just us and our thoughts. Being the middle child of five, there is always something happening in my parents' house and, therefore, this was a rather unique experience for me. I knew that I needed to make the most of the time.

In the news these days there is more and more about gender identity and if children should be allowed and encouraged to consider a gender change. There is also so much in the media about the way we look: are we thin enough, are we muscly enough, do we have the right hair colour, should or shouldn't we wear makeup? (Yes, these days, both males and females have these problems.) We are told to look at ourselves and to compare ourselves to those around us and to unrealistic

get that this is the most important thing. We also understand that it is important to love others, but what isn't quite so clear is that we need to love ourselves. It is crucial that we are content within our own body, mind and soul because if God asks us to love others as much as we love ourselves then we first must know how to love ourselves. Otherwise how will we know how to properly love others?

As we head on into the New Year there will be more local evangelism as above, but I also sense that this coming year will be a new era for us all as we seek the Lord's way forward.



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
Jim writes ...

The bulk of my TFM work over the last four or five months has been all about starting to get organised for the 'Gathered In' Mission. This mission is planned for 19 September to 6 October 2019 and is happening in the Church of Ireland Diocese of Kilmore, Elphin and Ardagh. This Diocese essentially covers the counties of Cavan, Longford, Leitrim, Roscommon, a good part of Sligo and a small part of southern Fermanagh. A large area but with only a very small Christian / Evangelical population. The bulk of those living in the area are Irish Catholics.

We have been invited to facilitate this mission with churches in the Diocese by their Bishop, Ferran Glenfield. Bishop Ferran is an old friend of TFM, having had TFM working alongside him in missions while he was a Rector in Dublin. Within the Diocese there are many small, rural churches. However, only around twenty seven Parishes as these small churches are organised into 'Groups of Parishes' with each group containing between three and seven churches. It has been quite a task communicating with this number of Parish Groups but we are now beginning to see some shape develop in the mission plans.

I have had the assistance of New Wine Ireland's, and past TFM Team Member, George Newell to recruit and gather Team Members for the mission; this is an ongoing process. Along with Irish Team Members I have also been able to get other organisations involved with events the churches are planning. Crown Jesus Ministries from Belfast are keen to assist, along with Operation Mobilisation Ireland and other individuals who have expertise in children's work, school's work, creationism and apologetics.

I have also been involved with a fair amount of 'street evangelism'. This has mostly taken place in Belfast City Centre but also at the Irish Ploughing Championships which took place in Co. Offaly back in September. This was an excellent week, even though Storm Ali wiped out the marquee we were working out of! I worked alongside the Irish Evangelistic Band and OM Ireland and we had literally 100s of gospel conversations over the three days. An estimated 300 000 people visited the Championships over the three days, making it the largest agricultural show in Europe.

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Prayer Warriors...

A few years ago, I was taking communion to one of the congregation who was housebound – now 89 and with complex medical issues, this lady found herself unable to leave the house and was entirely dependent on the care and support of her daughter.

In that communion service I learnt something I never forgot. This lady was very troubled – and, I thought, of course she would be, her life was not easy. Yet to my shame I had overlooked her faith journey. Actually, the thing that was troubling her most was the feeling that she could do nothing for her church, for Jesus.

And so, we began a conversation on prayer – on the value, the power of prayer. I would take her topics to pray for: - and she would pray through the newspaper. Over the years I valued the time I spent with her – the presence of God was so real in the sitting room....

I was reminded of this because I have heard from a number of people who would love to be out on mission teams but are unable due to age or infirmity. And I want to say to you – it's not over. You are far more valuable than you realise. We need you to be prayer warriors – for TFM; for your church; for the world.

And I want to say to anyone who knows someone who is feeling their age or is struggling with illness: - tell them how valuable they are, tell them about the urgent need for prayer. Give them things to pray for...

(There are regular prayer points emailed out weekly, so please ask to go on that list ... but do remember those who have no access to internet:- print off a copy and give it to them, or just ring the office and speak to a real person and ask them to tell you the prayer points if that helps...)

PS.. Just back from Cornwall, where I was inspired by John and Zena – they are prayer warriors, but also attend regular prayer meetings so they can pray with others... where two or three... Who could you meet with, just to pray?


I think we need to record these. Would you do me a favour and write down a couple of lines – a testimony to what God has done for you through TFM... and then either email it, or post it to the office?
